

ORDINANCE NO. 50

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 42 of the City of Detroit entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE regulating, as authorized by ORS 215.110, enlargement, alteration, repair, moving, removal, conversion, demolition, occupancy, equipment, use height, area and maintenance of buildings and structures in the City of Detroit, Oregon; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; providing penalties for the violation thereof; providing for appeals; repealing Ordinance No. 34 & 35 and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and declaring an emergency.",

to amend and change the fee schedule for building, plumbing and building demolition permits, and declaring an emergency.

THE CITY OF DETROIT ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 42 of the City of Detroit entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE regulating, as authorized by ORS 215.110, enlargement, alteration, repair, moving, removal, conversion, demolition, occupancy, equipment, use, height, area and maintenance of buildings and structures in the City of Detroit, Oregon; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; providing penalties for the violation thereof; providing for appeals, repealing Ordinance No. 34 & 35 and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and declaring an emergency."

is hereby amended by deleting the table appearing in Section 6 thereof and substituting the following table in lieu thereof:

CITY OF DETROIT FEE SCHEDULE

BUILDING PERMIT FEES

Less than \$20.00	\$2.50
\$20.00 to \$25.00	\$2.50
More than \$25.01	\$5.00

PLUMBING PERMIT FEES

Permit \$2.50 for first fixture and \$1.00 for each additional fixture

Each trailer sewer hookup	\$2.50
Minimum fee for permit	\$5.00
Septic Tank Inspection Fee	\$2.50
Lawn Sprinkler Systems	\$2.50

BUILDING DEMOLITION

Regardless of type of building	\$2.50
--------------------------------	--------

Section 2. The foregoing schedule of fees is in addition to any and all fees imposed by Marion County, Oregon.

Section 3. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor.
