

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ACCORDING TO LAW AND THE EXISTING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF DETROIT, OREGON, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADOPTING OR REJECTING THE PROPOSED NEW CHARTER FOR THE SAID CITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS:

The Common Council of the City of Detroit, Oregon, met in regular session in the Detroit School building of said City upon the 9th day of November, 1954 at 8:00 p.m., all members thereof being present, and

WHEREAS:

Said Council deems it necessary to propose to the people the adoption of a New Charter of said City, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DETROIT, OREGON AS FOLLOWS:

- 16-1 There shall be referred to the voters of said city of Detroit for the rejection or approval at a special election, which said election will be held upon the 27th day of December, 1954 at the Detroit School building in Detroit, Marion County, Oregon, commencing at 1:00 p.m. and continuing until 8:00 p.m. of said day for the purpose of submitting the above proposition to the voters of said City.
- 16-2 That the following named persons are hereby named as the election board to hold said election, the first named person shall be the chairman of said election board, that the compensation for the members of said election board is to be in the sum of \$1.00.

- 16-3 The Recorder is hereby directed to give notice of said election by posting a complete copy of this ordinance, together with a full and complete copy of the Notice of Election and of the proposed New Charter to be voted upon at said Special Election; at each of four public places in Detroit, Oregon, for a period of 20 days after the passage of this Ordinance and prior to the holding of the Election called for herein.
- 16-4 It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety and general welfare of the City of Detroit, Oregon, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the

City of Detroit, Oregon, and upon the signing hereof by the Mayor of said City.

Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion to be unanimously carried and the Ordinance adopted.
