

ORDINANCE NO. 14

AN ORDINANCE REFERRING TO THE VOTERS OF DETROIT THE MEASURE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF THE CITY OF DETROIT TO THE IDANHA RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AND PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PEOPLE OF DETROIT TO VOTE UPON SAID MEASURE AND NAMING AN ELECTION BOARD TO HANDLE SUCH ELECTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The City of Detroit ordains as follows:

14-1 That there shall be referred to the voters of the City of Detroit for their rejection or approval at the special election herein provided for the following measure:

"A measure providing for the annexation of the City of Detroit to the Idanha Rural Fire Protection District.

Section 1. The City of Detroit shall be annexed to and become a part of the Idanha Rural Fire Protection District for the purpose of furnishing fire protection to the inhabitants of the City of Detroit."

Section 2. That a special election be held in the City of Detroit, Oregon, on the 16th day of February, 1954, the voting place for said election to be at Detroit School in said city and the election to be held between the hours of 5:00 pm and 8:00 pm on said date.

Section 3. That the following-named persons are hereby named as the election board to hold said election, the first-named person to be chairman of said election board, and the compensation for the members of said election board to be the sum of \$1.00:

Margaret Howland

Section 4. Emergency Clause. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Detroit and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect when signed by the mayor.
