

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A MUNICIPAL COURT, PRESCRIBING THE JURISDICTION OF SAID COURT AND THE PROCEDURE THEREIN, CREATING THE OFFICE OF MUNICIPAL JUDGE, PRESCRIBING THE QUALIFICATIONS THEREOF, METHOD OF SELECTION AND POWERS OF THE MUNICIPAL JUDGE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The City of Detroit ordains as follows:

- 5 - 1 There is hereby created the municipal court for the City of Detroit, Marion County, Oregon.
- 5 - 2 The territorial jurisdiction of the municipal court shall be the territory embraced within the boundaries of the City of Detroit. The municipal court shall have original jurisdiction of all offenses defined and made punishable by the ordinances of the city.
- 5 - 3 The Procedure in the municipal court shall be the same as that now prevailing in justice of the peace courts in the State of Oregon in the trial of criminal cases except that all matters shall be heard by the municipal judge without a jury.
- 5 - 4 There is hereby created the office of municipal judge.
- 5 - 5 *The jurisdiction of the municipal judge is hereby prescribed by the provisions of the ordinance of the City of Detroit, Oregon, which is hereby amended by the deletion of Section 5-5 of Ordinance #89, passed October 9, 1990.*
- 5 - 6 The municipal judge shall have all powers now possessed by justices of the peace in the State of Oregon in criminal cases.
- 5 - 7 In view of the fact that it is necessary that the administrative machinery of government for the City of Detroit be put into operation immediately, it is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Detroit, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force and effect when signed by the Mayor.
