

ORDINANCE NO. 91

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A NUMBERING SYSTEM FOR BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF DETROIT, OREGON; PROVIDING RULES AND REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO SAME; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

"The City of Detroit, Oregon" ordains as follows:

Section 1. Numbering of Buildings. There (shall) be a uniform system of numbering of houses, stores and other buildings (excepts sheds or out buildings) erected or to be erected within the city limits of the City of Detroit, Oregon by placing on the street address side of the main building where easily visible or if main entrance is not easily visible from frontage street by placing a three foot post on driveway at frontage street entrance to property, or as near as practicable, its proper number as shown on the map now on file in the city office.

Section 2. Assignment of Numbers. The city recorder is to assign to each house and building located in said city its respective number under the uniform system provided for in section 1 under this ordinance. The number shall be assigned on a frontage basis.

Section 3. Owner Responsibility. Numbers shall be placed within 60 days after the city recorder has assigned the appropriate number. The cost of the number or numbers shall be borne entirely by the owner of the building.

Section 4. Specifications. The figures designating the numbers whether printed or otherwise shall be at least four inches in height and placed in such a position to be readily seen from the front of the property.

Section 6. Penalty. Any owner of any building now erected within said city, or any other person having the control thereof, who shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of this ordinance as to the numbering of the same; or any person who shall take down, alter or deface any number that has been assigned or put up as aforesaid; or any person who shall use or display upon a building an improper number or one different that which this ordinance provides for, shall be deemed guilty of violation of this ordinance and upon violation, shall be fined not less than \$25.00 or not more than \$100.00.

Section 7. Public Buildings. The city recorder shall place the numbers required upon all city public buildings, the cost thereof to be paid by the city.

Section 8. Severability. Should any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of any other section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase; and if this ordinance or any portion thereof should be held to be invalid on one ground but valid on another, it shall be construed that the valid ground is the one upon which the ordinance or such portion thereof was enacted.

Section 9. Emergency. It being necessary for the peace, health, safety and sound development of the City of Detroit an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage by council and approval by the mayor.
