

ORDINANCE No. 1

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PROCEDURE FOR THE PASSAGE OF ORDINANCES AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The city of Detroit ordains as follows:

Section 1. ENACTING CLAUSE. The enacting clause for all ordinances shall be: "The city of Detroit ordains as follows:".

Section 2. INTRODUCTION, READING AND PASSING. Every ordinance shall be fully and distinctly read in open council meeting on two different days previous to being put upon its final passage, but any ordinance may be introduced, read twice, once in full and once by title, and put on its final passage at a single meeting by a unanimous vote of all members of the council present at the meeting. Upon the final vote, the ayes and naves of the members of the council shall be taken and recorded in the Journal. If the ordinance passes, the recorder shall endorse it with the date of its passage and his name and the title of his office, and within three days thereafter, the mayor shall sign it with the date, his name, and the title of his office.

Section 3. TIME OF EFFECT. An ordinance enacted by the council shall take effect thirty days after it has been signed by the mayor; provided, however, that ordinances necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety shall take effect when signed by the mayor.

Section 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the city of Detroit, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force and effect when signed by the mayor.

Read by title and in full this 9th day of September; 1952.

Read a second time by title this 9th day of September, 1952.

Passed by the council this 9th day of September 1952.
