ORDINANCE NO. 24

Oregon all jurisdiction and authority of all dog control problems. relating to nuisances, and transferring and releasing to Marion County, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE No. 29 and Repealing Ordinance No. 73,

THE CITY OF DETROIT, OREGON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 29-3 is amended to read:

29-3 Animals running at large.

29-3(1) The City of Detroit surrenders, releases and transfers to Marion County, Oregon, all dog licensing and control problems and programs. Marion County shall have exclusive jurisdiction and authority of all dog licensing and control problems and programs within the city limits of Detroit, pursuant to the provisions of ORS Chapter 609, including any amendments hereafter enacted to such laws.

29-3(2) No owner or other person in charge of any livestock or other animal shall permit such livestock or other animal to run loose or be at large in the city. This section shall not apply to dogs which are subject to the exclusive authority and control by Marion County under ORS Chapter 609.

29-15(2)(a), relating to acts declared to constitute unnecessary noise in violation of the ordinance, is amended to read:

The keeping of any fowl or animal which makes any loud, unusual, frequent or repeated noise which disturbs the peace and quiet of any part of the city, or annoys any person in the vicinity. This section shall not apply to dogs which are subject to the exclusive authority and control by Marion County under ORS Chapter 609.

ecution, conviction and punishment of a person who violates Ordinance No. 29, as amended by Ordinance No. 73, prior to the said ordinance shall remain in force to authorize the arrest, proseffective date of this ordinance. Ordinance No. 73, enacted August 11, 1981, is repealed; except that
